About the Exhibition

The exhibition, 'Christmas in the Archives: The Sentiment of a Christmas Message', featured cards, letters and postcards from multiple different collections located within Knowsley Archives Services.

These items highlight Christmas messages sent from around the world to and from residents right here in Knowsley, spanning from the 1910s to the 1990s. A few were from family in active duty sending seasons greeting to their loved ones, others from friends to friends wishing their family joy and happiness for the New Year and a charming Christmas greeting from Huyton Parish Church.

Many of the cards featured, held a traditional Christmas design either made by hand or manufactured. However, a good selection of them features unique designs such as a garden in full summer bloom and a view of Prescot in 1743.

The exhibition ran from Monday 3rd November 2025 to Tuesday 5th January 2026. It was located at Knowsley Archives Service at The ARK (Archive Resource for Knowsley) in The Kirkby Centre.





The Sending of Christmas Cards

Though it may seem like a timeless tradition, here in the United Kingdom we have been sending Christmas cards to our loved ones only since the mid-19th Century.

Whilst Queen Victoria may have sent the first Christmas card, the first commercial card that was available for the public to purchase and send was released in 1843. The first director of the Victoria and Albert Museum in London, Sir Henry Cole, commissioned the first commercial Christmas card and they were designed by the painter, John Callcott Horsley. Originally, there was only 1000 cards commissioned and each one was hand-coloured after being printed lithographically.

Ever since then, Christmas cards have been a part of the Christmas spirit, helping to send a message of goodwill to family members across the country and the world, to even your neighbour just across the street.

Although as we enter the digital age, the sentiment of sending cards, especially at Christmas, is slowly beginning to decline with younger generations sending well-wishes to each other through social media or even through text messaging.







Cabinet One

The family featured in the card, believed to be members of the Cole Family, appear to have already finished their food and have turned to face the viewer with their glasses raised and ready to toast to a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, as though the viewer is sitting at the head of the table with the family. Rather like any family gathering, featured at the table is a hearty meal and plenty to drink.

Either side of framed family setting, there are two different scenes also framed, that are depict two different acts of charity. As though to remind the viewer that whilst Christmas is a time for spending with the family, it is also a time to help those less fortunate and share the Christmas spirit of goodwill and togetherness.


Like any family gathering and Christmas 'get together', there is always room for chaos. A man can be seen keeping his attention on the rambunctious children in the background, though closer towards the viewer, a cheeky child has grabbed a glass and is having a large gulp of wine.



The first Christmas card, 1843, created by artist John Callcott Horsley (1817 - 1903) featuring three generations of the Cole Family who have enjoyed a hearty meal and are now toasting their drinks.







An eye-catching design featuring poinsettias with a red ribbon weaving in and out of the card.



Another design that captures the essence of Christmas with the use of colours and imagery, however this design is more subtle but still having a lasting impact.





A Wartime Christmas Message

A Christmas air letter addressed to Miss Eileen Wilson from Sgt. Norman Mutton with a 'greetings of the season' for Xmas 1944 message inside, from H.M Forces in the Middle East. The simple design of the letter folded within, the outside contains an address to the recipient and a declaration stating, 'I certify on my honour that the contents of this air letter refer to nothing but private and family matters'.



A Christmas greetings card bearing the crest of the Malayan Teachers' College, Penang, Malaya on the front and a detailed engraving of the College inside.






A Royal Flying Corps branded Christmas











Huyton Parish Church





A photostat of a Christmas card from Harold Wilson with his wife Mary, complete with a photograph of them with a Labrador at 'Grange Farm'.




