TEACHER TRAINING COLLEGE, KIRKBY FIELDS, KIRKBY

The following title documents were deposited by the Office of Government Commerce in 2005 following an audit of records held at The National Archives (TNA). The documents relate to the site of the former Royal Ordnance Factory Kirkby Hostel Sites 2 and 4 and surrounding area. Following World War II, the site was used as a teacher training college by Liverpool Corporation until 1951. The site was then handed over to the Federation of Malaya Teachers Training College, which was based there until its closure in 1962.

Further miscellaneous items from different sources, describing aspects of life at the Malayan Teacher Training College, have been added to the collection.

St. David's Church, on King's Drive (now Princess Drive), West Derby, was built to cater for the spiritual needs of the residents of Liverpool Corporation's Finch House Estate. It opened in a temporary hut on the 20th December 1937, with the Reverend R.C. Cundy as curate in charge. The permanent church and parochial hall were constructed shortly afterwards. The pulpit was made by a Mr Lucas from timber reclaimed from a demolished Liverpool church. The materials in this collection belonged to Reverend Cundy and were deposited by family members in April 2009.

The 'On War Service' badge was issued during the First World War to identify men who were employed in essential war work and to protect them from accusations of shirking and slacking. These badges were initially issued 'unofficially' by the companies who employed the men, but the scheme was adopted by the War Office in 1915 when the unofficial badges were withdrawn.

A badge for female munitions workers was issued by War Office from May 1916. Over 270,000 "On War Service" badges were issued to women between May and December 1916.

J.R. Gaunt and Son was established in 1750, producing military and uniform buttons since 1870 in Birmingham and in London from 1899.

ELEANORA ATHERTON'S CHARITIES

Eleanora Atherton was born on 14th February 1782, the elder of the two surviving daughters of barrister Henry Atherton (1740-1816) and Ann Byrom (1751-1826). During her lifetime, she made estimated gifts of £100,000 through her philanthropy between 1838-1870. The UCL Legacies of British Slave-Ownership database shows that Eleanora Atherton was awarded half of the compensation due for her deceased uncle William Atherton's estates in Jamaica - Spring Vale Pen in St. James and Green Park in Trelawny - along with Richard Willis of Halsnead, husband of Lucy Atherton, Eleanora's sister. Lucy died, a widow, 9th January 1859 and left her estate to Eleanora. In her will of 1861, Eleanora bequeathed £4,500.00 to build the alms houses in Prescott in memory of Mrs. Lucy Willis. The almshouses were ready to accept inmates who were members of the Established Church in 1862. Eleanora Atherton died on 12th September 1870.

These documents relate to endowments made to St. Nicholas' Church in Whiston and were transferred to Knowsley Archives from the Charities Commission in 2013.

The Norreys family held Halsnead until 1367, when the Manor was inherited by Thomas de Wetherby.

The Manor remained with the Wetherby and then Pemberton families until 1601, when the Estate was bought by John Ogle.

Liverpool Merchant Thomas Willis bought the Estate in 1684 and Halsnead remained with the Willis family until 1929, when it was sold by Charles Rodolph D'Anyers Willis. The Hall was finally demolished in 1932.
