The following collections of maps and plans have been listed wherever possible by the creating authority. The provenance of some of the collections is unknown, several deposits of maps having been made by the borough engineers and surveyors at different times.

Where the date of deposit and items within a collection are known, an accession number has been assigned e.g. KA48/O, or GB1076 if catalogued onto CALM. The maps within this collection include many Prescott UDC items and miscellaneous maps.

Those maps which have been copied from originals held at LRO such as tithe maps etc. have been designated Misc. and given the reference code Z.

Elsewhere, the maps have been sorted by creating authority and given a blanket reference such as LCC or Hu. E.g. KA/LCC/P for all maps and plans originating from Lancashire County Council, or KA/Hu/P for those originating from Huyton UDC.

The architectural plans are similarly listed. Those which were previously unlisted have been sorted by originating authority. The bulk of the plans however were sorted and catalogued already, and this arrangement has been left.

The following maps and plans were deposited by the Borough Engineer's Dept of KMBC in September 1979 with an additional deposit in 1982. They are miscellaneous and include maps from the predecessor authorities.

It should be noted that some of the Wrennall maps of 1878 have been amended without annotation and at a later date, with later buildings added by Huyton Local Board and HUDC.

Prescot Grammar School was founded in 1544 at the bequest of Gilbert Lathum, Archdeacon of the Isle of Man. It has undergone several changes in location and format since then, amalgamating with Prescot Grammar School for Girls to form Prescot Comprehensive School in 1977 and later merging with Higherside Comprehensive School, Whiston in 2009 to create Knowsley Park Centre for Learning, serving the community of Prescot, Whiston and the wider community. In 2016, the school took on Academy status and reverted to the name, The Prescot School. This collection, which includes deeds, documents, registers and ledgers, concerns the records of Prescot Grammar School.

Following the closure of the Co-operative Society premises in Prescot, the new owners called for assistance from the then curator of Prescot Museum and Knowsley Library Service to sort out the collection.
