ROBERT ATHERTON (ROBIN O' BOBS) Lancashire poet

Robert Atherton was born in Liverpool in 1861 the son of Robert Atherton and Ellen Hesketh. At the age of 22, he undertook studies in Holy Orders and in 1886 was given a curacy at Great Houghton, near Northampton. Later he was appointed Rector of St Dunstan's Parish Church, Bolnhurst, Bedfordshire, a post he held from 1888-1903. He was deprived of his post in 1904 and became a wandering poet, giving readings and selling printed copies of his work. Robert Atherton penned some of his work with the pseudonym Robin O' Bobs or Rupert Upperton and furthermore called himself 'The Lancashire Burns'

The Kirkby Historic Society collected much of the initial research material in the 1970's producing a booklet '*A Poet Without Honour: the life and work of Robert Atherton 1861-1930*' by Keith Cooper but in 1999, Mr Norman Atherton of Maghull deposited the completion of a large amount of additional genealogical research and further documentation. Furthermore, research on the life of Robert Atherton was deposited in June 2014 by Anthony McCarthy in the form of a Research Report (see KA88/P/Z21)

HUYTON COLLEGE COLLECTION

The school opened as 'Liverpool College for Girls,' Huyton, on 29 January 1894 in premises known as The Mount in The Orchard with just 20 pupils. In early 1897, the school transferred to the larger site of Huyton Hall, a mansion with spacious grounds and gardens but in time this too became insufficient for the school's needs. Further expansions followed including the purchase of Fernwood (the property next door), the renting of a number of large properties in St. Mary's Road to house the growing number of boarders and the later acquisition of St. Helena's House on Roby Road.

Huyton College remained open for 99 years and closed in 1993.

In 2003, Nancy Williams, former secretary to the Head Mistress at Huyton College, deposited the vast majority of the following material.
